

Welwyn Thaliens – A Short History

The Welwyn Thaliens formed in 1929 from a merger with two other amateur societies, the Barnstormers (drama) and the Operatic Society (music). The Old Welwyn Theatre in Parkway, later the Embassy Cinema, was the first venue. Most of the early shows were Gilbert and Sullivan productions. Dame Flora Robson, an early and active supporter, can still be remembered sweeping down the aisles. In those days ticket prices were 2/4d to 5/9d and a special London train, the 10.52 pm, was put on to take patrons back to the city. The society's first producer was A W Richardson and it wasn't long before musical shows and 'straight' plays poured out in succession while the reputation of the Thaliens grew. A large scale production of *St Joan* was reported favourably at length in the Daily Telegraph no less. Festival triumphs took the society as far as America, where the 'Lord Howard De Warden Cup' was won with *Not This Man* by Sidney Box. The Thaliens were also first at the Letchworth Festival. Before closing down for the duration in 1939 they presented the world premiere of *Castles in the Air* written for the society by Sidney Box and Montgomery Tully with music by May H Brahe. This South American romance starred Mildred Thompson in her debut as a dark haired seniorita. After the war, in 1947, the Thaliens were back in business with *The Gondoliers* and continued filling the Welwyn Theatre until in 1962 when, after a successful opening performance of *Carousel*, a fire broke out and the stage was destroyed. The members pulled together and the remaining performances were completed at a local school. When the Hawthorne theatre opened the Society moved in and have been performing happily there with many a good production ever since.

Guys and Dolls

The curtain rises on Broadway with restless movement and feverish atmosphere. Three gamblers, Nicely-Nicely, Benny and Rusty Charlie are pouring over the day's racing form in an effort to pick the day's winners. Near by is the Save-a-Soul Mission of the Salvation Army. Here Sky Masterson, a successful gambler, meets the Salvation Army Sergeant, Sarah Brown. He finds her fair game for his romantic sport. Sarah tells him in no uncertain terms that he is not her kind of man, and that when such a man comes along she will know.

At the Hot Spot night-club chorus girls are going through one of their routines. One girl, Adelaide, laments that she is addicted to psychosomatic colds; the cause, Nathan Detroit, another chronic gambler and her fiancée for 14 years. Nathan is busy trying to find a place to hold a floating crap game for some high players.

Meanwhile, Sky Masterson is pursuing Sarah. Stimulated by a bet, he decides to invite her to Havana. Her better judgment notwithstanding, Sarah goes off with Sky. In Havana she comes face to face with the glaring truth that she has fallen in love with him. Sky also realizes that he too is also deeply in love.

But after they return to Broadway, Sarah discovers that it is not love but a bet that was Sky's motive in taking her to Havana. She refuses to have anything more to do with him. Her troubles are compounded with the news that the Mission is in danger of closing down because not enough people take advantage of its services. With Sky's help, the Mission is saved: with his wide circle of friends on Broadway he can see to it that the Mission is crowded. Sarah's romantic interest in him is thereby revived. Her love affair with Sky achieves a happy resolution in marriage; and so, at long last, does that of Nathan and Adelaide.

Romance, however, is incidental in *Guys and Dolls* to the colorful picture provided of New York life, to the insight into the strange impulses and unique motivations governing the lives of some of the city's more picturesque characters.
